

Carolina Complete Health Network Is Proud To Offer AMH Practice Innovation Grants

Carolina Complete Health Network (CCHN) is delighted to announce the immediate availability of up to three innovation grants for contracted AMH Tier 2 practices interested in considering attesting to Tier 3 before the anticipated Go-Live of the state's Medicaid Transformation. The project will assess each selected practice's current state, identify any gaps in achieving Tier 3 readiness and collaborate with the practice to address those gaps before Go-Live.

CCHN is pleased to be able to fund the project. The only cost to participating practices is staff time and availability. This innovation project brings together CCHN's Enhanced Provider Engagement services and Emtiro Health's robust AMH consulting services.

Benefits to Practices

Practices participating in the CCHN Practice Innovation Project will gain a clear path to achieving AMH Tier 3 status, should they choose to pursue it. Practices electing to attest to Tier 3 may qualify for incremental fees from PHPs for assigned Care Management responsibilities. Practices would be eligible for these incremental Care Management fees from all contracted PHPs, not only Carolina Complete Health.

Practice Selection Criteria / Requirements

The project is open to all AMH Tier 2 practices contracted with Carolina Complete Health as of September 15, 2020. Applications will be accepted through September 30, 2020. The project is expected to commence in mid-October. Up to three (3) practices will be selected for participation.
